Duration and Scope

- Begins on Lunar New Year's Eve
- Lasts 15 days
- Ends with Lantern Festival
- Celebrated across China and globally



Preparations & Cleaning

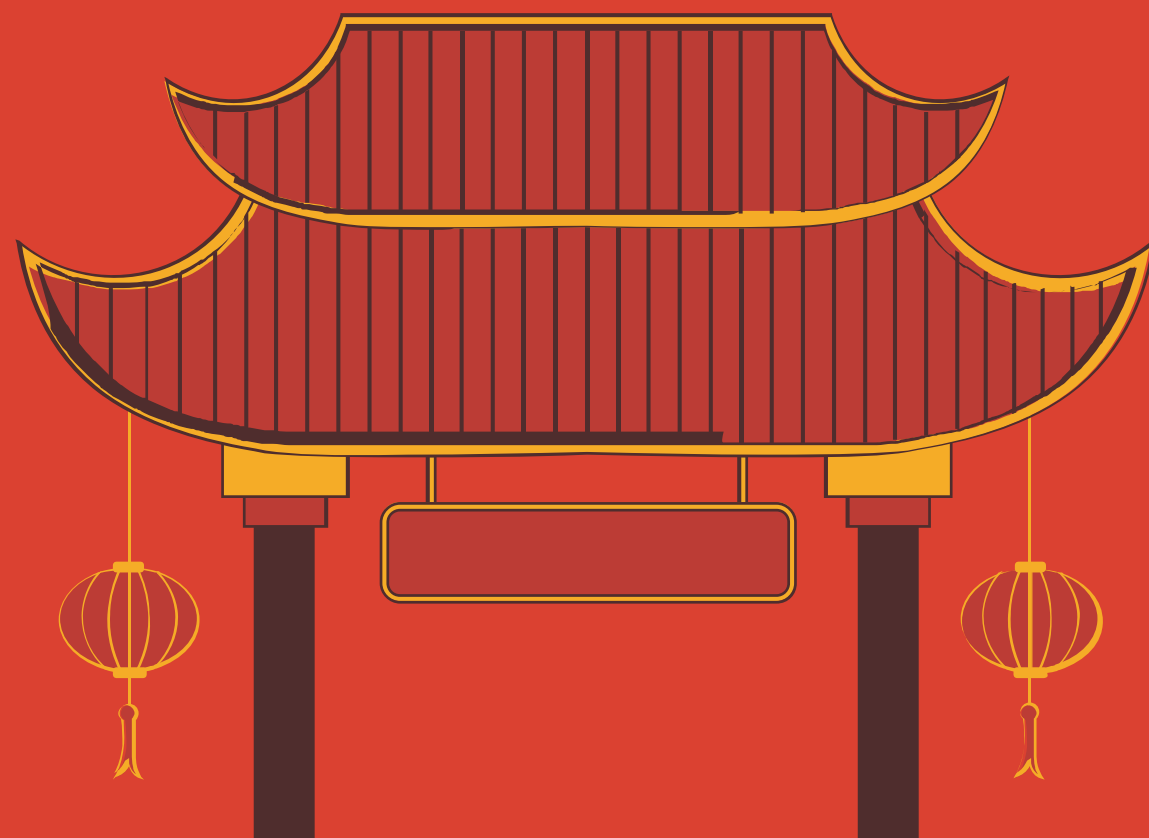


- Deep house cleaning
- Symbolic meaning: remove bad luck
- No cleaning on New Year's Day



Decorations and Symbols

- Red couplets, lanterns, and paper cuttings
- Upside-down “Fu” character: fortune has arrived
- Emphasis on red and gold



Red Envelopes (Hongbao)

- Given to children and unmarried young adults
- Symbol of protection and blessings
- 我们给孩子红包。



Firecrackers & Superstitions

- Scare away evil spirits (Nián)
- Loud noise and red color as protection
- Still common in rural areas



Reunion Dinner

- Held on New Year's Eve
- Importance of family
- Signature dishes: dumplings, fish, rice cakes
- 我喜欢吃饺子。



Symbolism in Food

- Dumplings = wealth
- Fish = surplus
- Niangao = progress and success
- Cultural importance of food symbolism



Lantern Festival

- 15th day of lunar calendar
- Community celebration
- Lantern displays, riddles, lion dances
- Food: Tangyuan (sweet rice balls)
- 元宵节我们吃汤圆。



Modern Celebrations

- Online red envelopes
- Urban celebrations and changes
- Celebrated globally





Cultural Meaning Today

- Importance of unity, tradition, and renewal
- The Spring Festival as a living tradition
- Relevance in modern life
