# DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

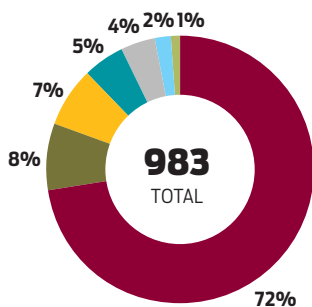

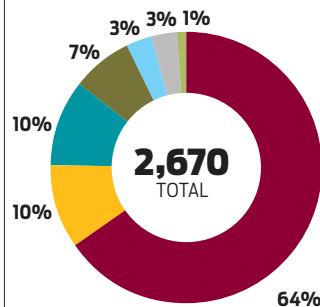
## STUDENTS In percent



## INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY In percent



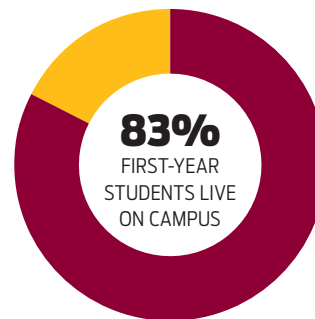

Loyola athletes consistently impress with their academic accomplishments. In the 2022-2023 academic year, Loyola's student-athletes posted an average 3.54 GPA, higher than the student body at large, with all 15 programs having a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. Graduation rates for Rambler athletes are regularly among the top five of all Division 1 colleges, often in the #1 spot, routinely tying or exceeding graduation rates for athletes at Ivy League schools.
