### **Biographical History**

Diane Simpson is a Chicago-based artist specializing in sculpture and drawings. She was born in 1935 in Joliet, Illinois. Diane Simpson received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 1971, and a Master of Fine Arts from the same institution in 1978. Diane Simpson's work has been heavily influenced by the architectural lines of Chicago and by the structures of clothing works. She uses a wide selection of materials including wood, perforated metals, fabric, and linoleum.

Her work is in the permanent collections at the Art Institute of Chicago; Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago; Illinois State Museum, Springfield; Racine Art Museum, Racine WI; Rockford Art Museum, Rockford IL; The James R. Thompson Illinois Center, Chicago, and the Samek Art Gallery, Bucknell University, Lewiston, Pennsylvania. Her grants and awards include an Arts Midwest/NEA Regional Fellowship; five Illinois Arts Council Visual Artist Fellowship awards; and the Walter M Campana and E. Garrison Prizes from the Art Institute of Chicago "Chicago and Vicinity" exhibitions.

## **Scope and Content**
