Biographical History

Malka Szejman (Sheiman) was born to Harry and Minka “Minnie” Sheiman in Sokołów, Poland on February 2, 1916. In 1929, at the age of 13, Malka immigrated to the United States with her parents and brother Louis and adopted the American name Mollie, which she would use for the rest of her life.

After arriving in Chicago with her family, Mollie had to overcome the language barrier, a physical handicap, and cultural assimilation. Because of her personal situation and the political leanings of her family, she found herself continually confronted with issues of social injustice. In 1934, in the

midst of the Great Depression, her high school threatened to cut extracurricular activities. Mollie, who enrolled in music lessons through the school, responded by organizing a student strike. She and several others were arrested and placed in a juvenile home. Claiming that this was the radicalizing moment in her life, after graduation she went on to work for the Farm Equipment Workers of America, an early CIO union (Congress of Industrial Organizations). There she ran the office, wrote and distributed print materials, and advocated community members to support strikes at any cost. Mollie had a strong presence at the Memorial Day Massacre in 1937 where she led singing at the rally for the Little Steel strike and later spoke out publicly against the violence that occurred that day. From this point, Mollie dedicated her life to organizing the labor movement.

Unfortunately, little is known about West from 1935-1962 when she was a member of the Communist Party. She initially joined the Young Communist League working as a labor organizer and later served as the secretary of the Illinois Communist Party. On June 30, 1940, Mollie married her first husband, Carl Lieber, who was also a Communist sympathizer. While serving overseas in the US Army, Lieber was killed in 1945 in a car crash near Nice, France. That same year Mollie served as an American Delegate to the World Youth Congress held in London and the World Student Congress in Czechoslovakia.

While working for the Communist Party, Mollie met fellow organizer James West. Mollie and James married in 1948 and adopted a baby boy, Steven, in 1951. Forced into underground hiding from 1953-1955 with her husband and son, Mollie finally broke ties with the Party in 1962 stating that, while she believed in their principles, the Party was not her life. Afterwards, she sought temporary employment as a proofreader while going to night school to learn the printing trade. At that time, women working in the printing trades was still a rarity. Mollie and James separated in 1966 and, after divorcing in 1969, Mollie lived as a single mother in Chicago.

From 1960-1987, Mollie broke gender barriers as a member of the Typographical Union. In 1973 she was the first woman elected to a union office in the Chicago Typographical Union, Local 16 (CTU) as a delegate to the International Typographical Union (ITU) Convention held in San Diego, California. She was one of only six women among the 350 attending delegates. That same year, West was the first woman to address the International Convention Union Council, the first female elected to the Executive Committee of CTU, and the first female appointed delegate to the Illinois state AFL-CIO (American Federation of Labor-Coalition of Industrial Organizations). For over thirty years, she served as a delegate to the Chicago Federation of Labor as well as to the Illinois State AFL-CIO. As founding member of Chicago chapter of CLUW (Coalition of Labor Union Women), Mollie served on the national executive board.

At the age of sixty she entered Mundelein's Weekend College, earning a bachelor's degree in labor education. Fearful of compulsory retirement at the age of sixty-five by her employer, the Daily Racing Form, she found a way to keep herself active and involved in Chicago labor education. In 1980, she organized an annual award for women labor leaders in the Chicago Federation of Labor-Industrial Union Council. After her retirement from the printing trade in 1987, she continued to promote education and recognition for labor leaders through her work at the Illinois Labor History Society as the administrative secretary and volunteer

Mollie received numerous awards and accolades over the years. She was recipient of the Annual Tribute to Labor Union Women held by the CFL-IUC (1987), inducted into Chicago Women's Hall of Fame (1990), awarded the Eugene V. Debs-Norman Thomas-Michael Harrington Annual Dinner Committee Award for achievement in service to the labor movement (1993), inducted into Senior Illinois Hall of Fame, Illinois Department of Aging (1994), and named Person of the Year by the Lake County AFL-CIO (1998).

Mollie West died August 7, 2015 at the age of 99.

Scope and Content

The papers of Mollie West span from 1916 to 2015 and span 30 linear feet (58 boxes). They are organized into thematic topics and often chronologically within each series. They document her activities as a labor activist and women's rights advocate. Most of the materials are secondary sources she saved and closely reflect her work and political ideologies. This collection includes subject files, correspondence, and pamphlets. The collection only loosely refers to her involvement with the Illinois Communist Party and the years she spent living underground during the McCarthy era through correspondence with her two husbands. It focuses primarily on her work in the labor movement and the various issues and organizations she was involved in such as CLUW, CTU, ITU, AFL-CIO, ERA, and the Illinois Labor History Society.

Series 1: Biographical and Family Information, 1916-2000, undated, Boxes 1-2

This series contains information about Mollie's life as well as her father Harry Sheiman, her mother Minnie Sheiman, and her son, Steven West. Formats include articles, awards, correspondence, and vital documents such as Mollie's immigrant identification card and Polish birth record (translated into English by the FBI). Some materials are in foreign languages such as Polish, Hebrew, and Yiddish. It is organized in alphabetic order by the title of each folder.

Series 2: Correspondence, 1947-1986, undated, Boxes 2-3

Largely personal correspondence between Mollie and others, this series is organized alphabetically by subject or name of correspondent. The bulk of this series contains personal letters between Mollie and her son during his time in law school. Also included is miscellaneous correspondence documenting both personal and professional relationships. Correspondence can also be found throughout the collection.

Series 3: FBI, 1940-1958, undated, Boxes 3-4

These are the declassified FBI files kept on Mollie, which were obtained by Steven West in 1993. Though most information is redacted (blacked out), these copies offer a sketch of West's activities and movements. Included is a copy of her marriage license with Carl Lieber, school records, surveillance of meetings, and the book, *FBI Secrets*, by M. Wesley Swearingen. Mollie is mentioned twice in the book.

Series 4: Mundelein College, 1976-1985, undated, Boxes 4-5

This series includes research notes, class information, articles, and correspondence from Mollie's enrollment in Mundelein College's Weekend College.

Series 5: Subject Files, 1956-1995, undated, Boxes 5-9

These subject files contain secondary materials on a variety of topics like affirmative action, CHAMPUS, communism, ERA, the feminist movement, Gold Star Wives of America. Also included are materials relating to various friends and associates. The second subseries focuses on the labor movement and labor organizations.

Subseries 5.1: General, 1956-1986, Box 5-6

Includes materials on a variety of topics including but not limited to the ERA, Gold Star Wives, Chicago, and Illinois.

Subseries 5.2: Labor 1962-1995, undated, Boxes 7-9

The second section focuses on the labor movement and various organizations West was involved with. A large part of this section includes the AFL-CIO, CTU, Illinois Labor History Society, ITU, and PATCO. However, there is also secondary information about the general history of the labor movement.

Series 6: Women in the Workforce, 1974-2002, undated, Boxes 9-11

Contains materials related generally to women in workforce and a second subseries with materials related more specifically to the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW).

Subseries 6.1: General, 1974-2002, Box 9-11

Mainly secondary information, which centers on the general concerns of female workers. A lot of these materials come from Mollie's involvement with the Illinois Commission on the Status of Women.

Subseries 6.2: Coalition of Labor Union Women, 1975-1987, undated, Boxes 11-12

This information relates to the day-to-day operations of CLUW. Comprised of both primary and secondary sources, this subseries consists of articles, correspondence, publications, legislation, and conference information.

Series 7: Photographs, 1959-1993, undated, Box 12

Most of the photographs in this collection consist of biographical images of Mollie in relation to her labor work. There are also images of her parents, son, and numerous unidentified pictures taken while on vacation.

Series 8: Audiovisual, 1990-2005, Box 13

Includes materials showcasing Mollie and the labor movement. The formats in this series include DVD, VHS, CD, and audio cassette. This series also includes CD and DVD copies of select materials that were digitized in 2016. Selections from this series are available digitally.

Series 9: Addendum 1, 1916-2006, undated, Boxes 14-20

This series contains Addendum 1, an accrual of materials that were processed but not incorporated with the series above. Similar and/or related materials listed above may also be found here. The papers found in this addendum primarily concern Mollie's life during her time as a Communist Party member. While very few direct references are made to this political affiliation, much of the correspondence directly reflects her activities with the Party. Mollie's first husband, Carl Lieber, is a strong presence in this collection. Much of the correspondence includes letters sent between

Mollie and Carl. He offers social commentaries/critiques of both the United States and Europe during World War II. Many of the photographs and artifacts in this collection reflect his military experience. Correspondence between Mollie and her second husband, James West, and information concerning her induction into the Illinois Senior Hall of Fame is also included.

Subseries 9.1: Biographical and Family Information, 1916-2004, undated, Box 14

Most of this subseries includes miscellaneous biographical information concerning West's life in the 1930s-1940. There are a variety of formats which include articles, artifacts, correspondence, and news clippings. Materials related to Mollie's induction into the Illinois Senior Hall of Fame are also included. In March 2016, certificates from Mollie and Carl's marriage were added, both the legal license and the ketubah (Jewish certificate).

Sub-subseries 9.1.1: General, General, 1937-2004

Includes certificates, ID cards, tax information, and more general biographical materials.

Sub-subseries 9.1.2: Carl Lieber, 1916-1973, undated

Includes items Mollie saved that once belonged to Carl. Spanning his lifetime, the majority represent his military career. There is a scrapbook, letters of recommendation from various employers and associates, IDs and membership cards, articles, and military paraphernalia. In March 2016, materials were added related to Carl's death and his burial.

Sub-subseries 9.1.3: Labor and Communist Activities, 1941-1943, undated

A very small subseries, this includes a handwritten memo of the Egyptian Branch of the Young Communists for Democracy. Also, there is a letter from the American Youth for Democracy and a United Auto Workers-Congress of Industrial Officers bulletin.

Subseries 9.2: Correspondence, 1941-1944, undated, Boxes 14-18

Divided into categories based on the sender, this is a comprehensive collection of correspondence between Mollie, her two husbands, and others. Mollie and Carl wrote very frequently through 1941-1945. Their letters deal with the social issues prevalent throughout this time, especially those concerning the war efforts and their work in the Communist Party. Mollie and her second husband also discuss their work in the Communist Party and talk a lot about their personal relationship.

Subseries 9.3: Photographs, undated, Box 18

There are many assorted photographs from the late 1930s and 1940s which are unlabeled. Organized by subject, many concern Mollie's activism in the labor movement. Others relate to Carl and Mollie's induction into the Illinois Senior Hall of Fame.

Subseries 9.4: 3-D Objects, Audiovisual, and Oversize, 1933-1945, undated, Boxes 19-20

Contains mostly three-dimensional objects belonging to Carl Lieber related to his youth and his time in the Army. Also included are two vinyl records with recordings of Carl's voice

that he mailed to Mollie while he served in the army. These records were digitized in 2016 and CD copies are also included.

Series 10: Addendum 2, 1963-2008, undated, Boxes 21-24

This series contains Addendum 2, a second accrual of materials that were processed but not incorporated with the series above. Similar and/or related materials listed above may also be found here. Most of the materials focus on Mollie's activities from age sixty onward: her travel, personal correspondence with friends and family, and awards commemorating her work as a labor movement and women's movement activist. The materials are organized alphabetically within each subseries.

Subseries 10.1: Biographical, 1969-2005, undated, Box 21

Contains materials related to Mollie's life as a union member and activist, including awards, membership cards, election materials, articles, and pension information. Also includes material pertaining to Mollie's family and her education at Mundelein College. Organized alphabetically by subject matter.

Subseries 10.2: Correspondence, 1963-2001, undated, Boxes 21-22

Contains correspondence from family, friends, and colleagues of Mollie organized chronologically.

Subseries 10.3: Secondary Materials, 1974-2005, undated, Box 22

Contains secondary materials in Mollie's collection relating to the Communist Party, labor union history, and local labor activism. Includes several foreign language booklets. Organized alphabetically by folder title.

Subseries 10.4: Miscellaneous, 1972, undated, Box 22

Ephemera related to Mollie's family as well as union and women's rights activism. Also contains the international driving permit of Edgar Ballard, whose connection to Mollie has yet to be investigated.

Subseries 10.5: Audiovisual, 1971-2008, undated, Box 23-24

Consists of one VHS tape, one photo collage, and approximately 300 photographs, including images of Mollie, her son Steven, Mollie's family and colleagues, travel, and events related to her labor activism.

Series 11: Addendum 3, 1926-2008, undated, Boxes 25-42

This series contains Addendum 3, another accrual of materials that were processed but not incorporated with the series above. Similar and/or related materials listed above may also be found here. This series includes papers, correspondence, photographs, photo albums, and objects from her personal, political, and professional life. The papers for the most part are secondary sources related to the Communist Party and the labor movements she was later involved with during her career. The personal papers here relate to her first husband Carl Lieber, her second husband James West, and her son Steven West. The collection is organized into subseries of biographical, FBI files, political activities, professional career, photographs, audiovisual, and 3-D objects. Folders are organized alphabetically by folder subject within each subseries.

Subseries 11.1: Biographical and Family Information, 1932-2008, undated, Boxes 25-27

Contains material relating to the adult life of Mollie West. This series also includes information on the Carl Lieber's death, correspondence and articles related to James West, and papers related to Steven West. The papers also include information on her travels abroad and correspondence with friends.

Subseries 11.2: FBI File, 1941-1960, undated, Boxes 28-29

Contains the declassified FBI files on Mollie, which were obtained by Steven West in 1994. Some information on the files has been redacted (blacked out), however, the files remain a good source of Mollie's early involvement with the Communist party.

Subseries 11.3: Political Activities, 1926-1951, undated, Boxes 29-31

Contains material related to Mollie's involvement with the Communist Party in Illinois. The series includes newsletters, programs, and pamphlets published by the Party. Mollie's participation in the World Youth Conference is also documented in the collection with correspondences, a journal, and general information.

Subseries 11.4: Professional, 1958-2007, undated, Box 31-32

Contains material related to Mollie's professional life and work in the Labor Movement. This series also includes articles written about Mollie as well as awards she has received, and information on the Memorial Day Massacre.

Subseries 11.5: Photographs, 1937-2006, undated, Box 32-38

The photographs in the collection chronicle Mollie's personal and professional life. It includes photographs of Mollie, James West, Steven West, and various friends and family. The series also includes photographs of her travels and disassembled scrapbooks.

Sub-subseries 11.5.1: General, 1936-2002, undated

Contains photos of family, friends, professional life, travel, and more.

Sub-subseries 11.5.2: Photo Albums, [1920s]-1985, undated

Includes photo albums from the West and Sheiman family, as well as Mollie's trip to the World Youth Conference, and other travels. It also includes a scrapbook about Mollie's campaign for ITU Delegate. The World Youth Conference photo album is very fragile and was digitized by a vendor in 2020. Consult archivist regarding access.

Subseries 11.6: Audiovisual, 1977-2002, undated, Boxes 39-40

Contains audiovisual material related to Mollie's professional contribution through Illinois Labor History Society, experience during the Memorial Day Massacre, and interviews conducted with Mollie West. The collection includes VHS, audiocassette, and ¼" audio open reel. The series also includes copies of some of these materials on CD and DVD from a digitization project in 2016.

Subseries 11.7: 3-D Objects and Oversize, 1945-1973, undated, Boxes 40-42, Flat File

This series contains memorabilia from her involvement in the Labor Movement and the World Youth Conference, Sheiman family artifacts, and an autograph copy of *My American Century* by Studs Terkel. The oversize materials include photographs, posters, and certificates for Mollie West and Carl Lieber.

Series 12: Addendum 4, 1916-2015, Boxes 43-56

This series contains Addendum 4, an additional accrual of materials that were processed but not incorporated with the series above. Similar and/or related materials listed above may also be found here. The papers relate to Mollie's personal and professional life, as well as her death in 2015, and include a collection of greeting cards West received from friends and family for various occasions. Most of the series is made up of objects such as jewelry, books, and photo albums.

Subseries 12.1: Biographical, 1949-2016, undated, Box 43

Contains materials relating to Mollie's benefits from the Veteran's Administration as the widow of her first husband, Carl Lieber. It also contains materials belonging to Mollie related to her labor union membership and other interests. Her friendships are represented in the series with a caricature of a friend labeled "Helen" and a craft project with a photograph of "Mollie and Shayna." This series also has materials related to Mollie's death in 2015 and photos of her grave.

Subseries 12.2: Correspondence, 1989-2008, undated, Box 43

Contains mostly cards, along with some letters sent to Mollie from family and friends. A separate folder holds photos taken from these correspondence and cards with attached photos.

Subseries 12.3: Books, 1962-2005, Box 44

Contains six books owned by Mollie, representing some of her interests. Four books are nonfiction, and two are novels.

Subseries 12.4: 3-D Objects, undated, Boxes 45-53

Contains scarves, jewelry, a wallet with the initials "M.S.L." and other personal objects belonging to Mollie. Also includes items related to her professional work, including a patch from the Typographical Union, a pen labeled "Local 336 International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers AFL-CIO," and a set of pins representing various unions and political activities. Jewelry includes pieces from Mollie's travels, as well as a silver French horn pendant necklace, which she is said to have worn often.

Subseries 12.5: Audiovisual, 1971-1996, undated, Boxes 53-56

Contains audiovisual materials including photo albums, photo frames, and audiocassettes. Two of the photo albums have photos from Mollie's trip to Europe with Ed Ballard, and another has photos of Mollie with Heather Bachman, who served as her caregiver for several years in the early 2000s. One album created by family and friends for her 80th birthday in 1995, contains photos and letters. Another small album has photos and news clippings of Mollie. Two frames from Mollie's home are included and contain photos that are stuck to the glass and cannot be removed. Three photo collages (removed from 16 x 20" frames)

contain photos of Mollie and loved ones from throughout her life. The four audiocassette tapes have labels in a non-English language and appear to contain music.
